INCORPORATING **SYNOD STANDING COMMITTEE NEWS**

Tuesday 23 October, 2018

On the evening of Monday 8 October 2018, the new Synod Standing Committee (SSC) met and began with devotions.

The Moderator, Rev Steve Francis, welcomed members: Rev Ken Williams, Acting Ex-Moderator; Rev David de Kock, General Secretary; Rev Lorraine Stokes, Presbytery Standing Committee Nominee; Rev Dr Ian Tozer; Heather Hamblin; Steve Higgins; Margaret Martin; Julie Ridden and Alison Xamon.

Budget and Finance Report

The General Secretary reported that as a consequence of the decision to reduce the deficit in the budget for 2019, he and the Manager, People and Culture, had addressed all the staff and met with individual members about the issues relating to the Uniting Church WA's financial situation. Several staff had accepted voluntary redundancies and a restructuring of Synod roles was in progress. Presbytery positions are still under review. It was noted that a process had been developed to communicate the information about the staff changes to the church as soon as possible. It was also agreed to develop a Communication Pack regarding contacts and roles within the Uniting Church Centre to be sent to all congregations.

Michael Patchell, Chief Financial Officer (CFO), reporting on behalf of the General Manager (Resources), presented the financial report, noting that stricter controls on expenditure and with limited access so far to the funds provided through the Strategic Plan, the actual deficit (\$180 000) to end August was considerably lower than projected in the budget (\$828 500).

He also addressed questions relating to the budget presentation for 2019 at the Synod meeting.

National Insurance Program

Michael Patchell (CFO), answered questions about the National Insurance Program (NIP) Heads of Agreement for Co-operation Agreement document. The Guiding Principles of the NIP are:

- All participants will benefit from cost savings and optimised coverage achieved through a collective NIP, as opposed to maintaining stand-alone Synod managed arrangements.
- The NIP promotes national collaboration, whilst recognising and catering for regional Synod needs.
- The NIP is commercially sustainable.
- The arrangements deliver measurable cost and operational efficiencies.

Following discussion and questions, SSC resolved by consensus to acknowledge the progress in developing the National Insurance Project and undertook to continue to participate in discussions, but given the legal framework of the church in Western Australia according to the Uniting Church in Australia (WA) Act 1976, didn't commit to the national insurance scheme at this time.

Nominating Committee

SSC resolved by consensus to appoint Rev Andrew Syme and Robert Watson, UnitingCare Forum nominee to SSC; David Beards, as chairperson of the Business and Financial Services Committee and Rev Alan Jeffrey as a member of the Ministerial Benefits Committee.

SSC also resolved by consensus to appoint Kristian Stratton, Jodie Wallace and Antiopi Orkopoulas to Penrhos College Council; and Dr Martin Samy to Tranby College Council.

SSC acknowledged the resignation of Michael Brady from the UnitingCare West Board.

Moderatorial Nominating Committee

SSC resolved by consensus to appoint Robert Watson and Rev John Dunn to co-Chair the Moderatorial Nominating Committee. The purpose of the Committee is to seek nominations of people who can provide leadership as Moderator. The Moderator-Elect for the triennium 2020 to 2023 will be elected at the 43rd Annual Meeting of the Synod of Western Australia to be held from Friday 13 to Sunday 15 September 2019.

The General Secretary also provided a draft document on the needs and issues for the church in the 2020–2023 Triennium, and a draft program for the Moderatorial Nominating Committee. The Standing Committee will consider these at the December and February 2019 meetings. Nominees for the Committee will be considered following the Presbytery meeting in February 2019.

Safe Church

SSC resolved by consensus to approve the proposal to establish a National Safe Church Unit, in conjunction with each of the other Synods and the Assembly, and

committed to support and resource the Unit's work for five years, subject to an earlier review process than the current three-year timeframe and further discussion regarding the cost-sharing mechanism.

SSC endorsed the National Safe Church Unit governance charter:

- to provide strategic leadership of the National Safe Church Unit in accordance with the Uniting Church's mission;
- to monitor the implementation of strategy and decisions of the National Safe Church Unit;
- to provide oversight of the management of the finances and resources of the National Safe Church Unit;

- to monitor risk and compliance of the National Safe Church Unit;
- to provide oversight of the overall performance of the National Safe Church Unit.

SSC Meeting Dates

SSC will meet on Monday, 10 December 2018; 11 February, 8 April, 10 June, 12 August, 14 October and 9 December 2019.
